## Volunteer Bloodrunner Role Information

### **Bloodrunner – Role Description**

To transport blood, associated blood products, human milk and urgent clinical items from a given collection point to a given delivery point, mainly from the National Health Service Blood Transfusion Centre at Cambridge to the five hospitals we serve - from the most northern at Peterborough to the most southern at Ipswich operating at all times within our Service Level Agreement, charity disciplines and procedures. Bloodrunners must be reliable, have a strict disciplined approach, be able to follow instructions, and to be able to work closely with colleagues and controllers.

Bloodrunners main tasks and responsibilities: -

- Required to be on duty a minimum of two nights per calendar month including weekends and bank holidays
- The duty rota is from 19.00 – 07.00 operating 365 nights of the year
- Own suitable transport required for carrying out the task/s – car/motorcycle or both
- Bloodrunners wishing to use motorbikes for duties must hold a current Advanced Rider Qualification with either RoSPA or IAM
- Required to attend training in line with the policy of SERVSC.
- Required to attend a minimum of two fundraising events per calendar year
